EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 137
SERIES OF 2021

(OPLAN "PUYO" 8-15-31)

"AN ORDER ENFORCING A HEIGHTENED STATE OF MODIFIED ENHANCED COMMUNITY QUARANTINE (MECQ) IN CEBU CITY AND PROVIDING RULES AND GUIDELINES THERETO"

WHEREAS, on August 11, 2021, the Chief Pathologist of the Department of Health Region 7 confirmed the local community transmission of the fearsome COVID-19 variant, which is commonly referred to as the Delta variant. This variant was first detected in India, and is subsequently spreading like wildfire throughout the Asian region. Thus, the Delta variant has reached our shores and now threatens our lives;

WHEREAS, science vouches that the Delta variant is 40% to 60% more transmissible and virulent than the previously dominant Alpha variant (Kent/UK variant). Patients infected with the Delta variant are more likely to develop pneumonia and/or require oxygen than those infected with the other COVID-19 variants;

WHEREAS, the case fatalities with previous variants were mostly limited to the elderly and those with comorbidities. With the Delta variant, however, younger people and children have been reported to be susceptible of infection. Many of these younger people and children are feared to suffer moderate to severe cases requiring hospitalization and even resulting in death;

WHEREAS, a number of COVID-19 pandemic-related Executive Orders have been previously issued by Cebu City Mayor Edgardo Colina Labella. Yet, the advent of the dreaded Delta variant calls for an enhanced act of self-preservation which needs to be contained in an official document for the direction and guidance of all concerned;

WHEREAS, the spread of the Delta variant has already overwhelmed our hospitals burdened our medical professionals and depleted our resources. The current situation puts the City in a more critical and ominous situation than before when it settled for an Enhanced Community Quarantine (ECQ) by virtue of Executive Orders 082 and 083, respectively;

WHEREAS, the mandate of Section 15, Article II of the 1987 Philippine Constitution which states, "The state shall protect and promote the right to health of the people and instill health consciousness among them," compels the Cebu City Government





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to institute a more comprehensive and drastic response to curb the spread of the highly transmissible and more virulent COVID-19 Delta variant;

WHEREAS, under the current circumstances and in the spirit of nationalism, patriotism, heroism, professionalism, cooperation, brotherhood and comity, a call to action is made for the people to voluntarily present themselves, perform civic duty, and serve at their best to protect humanity and end this pandemic;

NOW THEREFORE, I, MICHAEL L. RAMA, the Acting City Mayor of the City of Cebu, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law do, hereby order:

I **GENERAL GUIDELINES**

Section 1. ***Compliance with the Minimum Public Health Standards.*** – Minimum public health standards shall be complied with at all times for the entire duration of the MECQ period.

Section 2. ***Mandatory Wearing of Face Masks in Public Places.*** – All persons within the territorial jurisdiction of the City of Cebu are directed to wear face masks at all times when in public places.

Section 3. ***Mandatory Stay-At-Home Order.*** – All persons in the City of Cebu shall, at all times, stay at home during the period of effectivity of this Order. Those individuals violating the Mandatory Stay-At-Home Order and seen staying outside the home or residence without ample justification or reason shall be apprehended and may be prosecuted in the proper courts.

The Mandatory Stay-At-Home Order shall not apply to the following:

- a. Medical practitioners, officers, hospital staff, nurses, and health volunteers for the purpose of rendering medical assistance and/or service
- b. Emergency personnel, security personnel, and force multipliers
- c. All authorized national and local government officials and employees
- d. Drivers and personnel or delivery vehicles carrying all types of cargoes
- e. Accredited media personnel
- f. Farmers, fishermen, and agri-business personnel
- g. Persons who seek medical attention or who are already admitted in any medical facility provided that only one companion shall be allowed
- h. Employees of establishments and offices permitted to operate as provided under Section 21 hereof.



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Section 4. ***Parental Responsibility and Accountability.*** – All parents, guardians, heads of the family, and persons having custody of and exercising parental authority over minors shall bear the full responsibility of keeping the children and minors strictly at home or in their respective places of abode at all times. Unless exempted by these rules, every parent or guardian shall bear full responsibility should any child or minor escape their custody and violate the "Stay-At-Home" order that is being strictly imposed by these rules.

Section 5. ***Individual Responsibility and Accountability.*** – Every individual of legal age, unless mentally incapacitated or retarded, is presumed to possess such modicum of intelligence to discern simple and unequivocal rules designed for his and the community's protection and well-being. Every adult individual, conscious of his rights and entitlements, is likewise presumed to understand that the exercise of one's individual rights and freedoms carries with it individual responsibility and accountability. Thus, he alone, and not the government, must bear the full responsibilities of his actions, or inactions, consciously made with the full discernment of the possible consequences resulting therefrom.

Section 6. ***Parental Supervised Household Lockdown.*** – All parents, guardians, heads of the family, and persons having custody of and exercising parental authority over minors are hereby directed to strictly implement the parental supervised household lockdown within their respective household. This shall include, being always informed about the COVID-19 situation in the City, and other appropriate acts such as but not limited to the following:

- a. Coordinating and linking with the barangay or the Task Force "Puyo" for any concerns within the household.
- b. Assigning a protocol enforcement marshal to make sure that members in the household follow minimum public health standards.
- c. Monitoring the movements (coming-in and going-out) of members in the household.
- d. Prohibiting gatherings outside of residences, and gatherings at residences with any person outside of one's immediate household.
- e. Making sure that face masks and face shields are not shared, and practicing other health-enhancing behaviors.
- f. Keeping the house safe, clean, and well-ventilated.
- g. Protecting others in the community by staying at home especially when one is sick, with flu-like symptoms, has allergies, or is not feeling well.
- h. Not discriminating against a member in the household or anyone in the community who is sick.
- i. Immediately informing the barangay health worker of any suspected case or illness of a member in the household.



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The parent, guardian, head of the family, or person having custody of and exercising parental authority over minors shall immediately designate a separate room or space, if feasible, as an isolation area for the sick person to avoid infecting others in the household while waiting for the proper assessment by a medical doctor or health personnel.

Furthermore, the parent, guardian, head of the family, or person having custody of and exercising parental authority over minors shall make sure that the person within the household who is swabbed and waiting for the result shall remain at home. Going out of the home while waiting for the swab result shall constitute a violation of this Executive Order.

Section 7. *Movements Outside the Home.* – Notwithstanding the previous Section, persons going outside their homes and through designated Intra-Inter Barangay Protocol Quarantine Points shall present any proof of identity as stated in Section 16 of this Executive Order and shall be allowed only (a) for purposes of accessing or obtaining essential goods and services and basic necessities from permitted establishments, (b) for work in establishments and offices permitted to operate, and (c) for humanitarian reasons.

Section 8. *Curfew.* – As contained in previously issued Executive Orders of the City of Cebu, the curfew schedule shall start from 10:00 P.M. until 4:00 A.M. the following day. This curfew schedule shall apply to all establishments and offices permitted to operate during the MECQ period.

However, the Authorized Persons Outside Residence (APORs), employees of BPOs, health workers, and government agencies providing frontline and emergency services shall be exempted. Workers, cargo vehicles, public transportation, and operating hours of permitted establishments, however, shall not be restricted by such curfew hours.

Section 9. *Continuing of the Vaccination and Blood Letting Programs.* – The vaccination program of the City Government shall continue. The vaccination sites will only admit people who have received confirmatory text messages from CEBUCITYVAX. All residents of the City of Cebu are encouraged to register for vaccination through www.pabakunata.com.

The blood letting program of the City Government shall also be unhampered despite the proclamation of the MECQ.



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II ENFORCEMENT AND TASK FORCE

Section 10. **Guiding Principle in the Enforcement.** – As a guiding principle, there shall be bottoms-up enforcement of all the Sections of this Executive Order.

Also, enforcement of the Sections of this Executive Order shall not be limited only to the movement of people along streets, highways, alleyways, and other thoroughfares. Special emphasis must also be directed at specific destinations where people will naturally converge, congregate, or assemble either for work, business, and pursuit of livelihood or leisure.

Section 11. **Inter-LGU Perimeter Protocol; Coordination with Neighboring LGUS.** – The Cebu City Government shall coordinate with the Province of Cebu, and the Cities of Talisay, Lapu-Lapu, and Mandaue regarding the perimeter manning, perimeter handling, perimeter control, and border and boundaries management.

Section 12. **Police Deployment of 70% On-Duty Complement; Around-the-Clock Foot Patrol.** – Every police precinct in cooperation with the Task Force "Puyod", described in the succeeding Section, must deploy around-the-clock foot patrol and perform random inspections at streets, highways, alleyways, thoroughfares, and spaces utilized for convergence. Inspections shall also be done in the following places, such as but not limited to:

- a. Carbon Market, public markets, wet markets, and *Bagsakan*
- b. Supermarkets, grocery stores, department stores, and malls
- c. Terminals for public utility vehicles, ports of entry, and coastal areas
- d. Parks, playgrounds, and outdoor sports arenas
- e. Barangay halls and barangay multi-purpose complex
- f. Churches, Mosques, and places of worship
- g. Empty lots and other similar areas
- h. Other analogous places to the foregoing.

All station commanders are required to deploy not less than 70% of their on-duty complement to be on the field in order to conduct inspections and enforcement in the places and destinations above enumerated. Failure to comply with this directive shall be considered as a serious dereliction of duty or outright insubordination.

Section 13. **Task Force "Puyod".** – In order to maintain public order, protect and secure life and property, and to enforce all the Sections of this Executive Order and



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previously issued Executive Orders, the Task Force "*Puyo*" shall be established to implement the Sections of this Executive Order and shall be composed of the following to be chaired by the City Chief of the Philippine National Police having jurisdiction of the area, to wit:

- a. Armed Forces of the Philippines
- b. Philippine National Police
- c. Cebu City Traffic Office
- d. Prevention, Restoration, Order, Beautification, and Enhancement (PROBE)
- e. Punong Barangay
- f. Barangay Environmental Office
- g. Public Information Office
- h. Force multipliers
- i. Other agencies and persons as may be authorized by law.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Roman Catholic Church, other Christian denominations, Islam, and inter-faith groups shall be involved in the enforcement of health protocols and creation of guidelines pertaining to spiritual, psychosocial, and psycho-spiritual matters of the people.

Section 14. ***Agents of Persons in Authority at the Inter-Intra Barangay Protocol Quarantine Points.*** – The Inter-Intra Barangay Protocol Quarantine Points, described in the succeeding Section, shall be manned by persons considered as agents of persons in authority. Such persons who resist or disobey persons in authority or agents of persons in authority shall be charged with the crime of Resistance and Disobedience under Article 151 of the Revised Penal Code (RPC).

Section 15. ***Inter-Intra Barangay Protocol Quarantine Points.*** – In order to maintain public order, protect and secure life and property, and to enforce Sections of this Executive Order, all barangays in the City of Cebu, through their respective officials headed by the Punong Barangay, in coordination with the Task Force "*Puyo*", shall establish and implement the Inter-Intra Barangay Protocol Quarantine Points to restrict movements of persons for essential and work-related purposes only, including the conduct of permitted establishments, persons, or activities in order to minimize the transmission of infection and personal contacts.

Section 16. ***Proof of Identity to be presented to Law Enforcers at the Inter-Intra Barangay Protocol Quarantine Points.*** – Movement outside the sitios and barangays shall be strictly regulated. Law enforcement officers and agencies in coordination with the Task Force "*Puyo*" assigned at Inter-Intra Barangay Protocol Quarantine Points shall require the presentation of any of the following proof of identity, which shall be returned after checking:





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- a. Cebu City Hall ID
- b. Any valid government-issued ID
- c. Any bonafide ID issued by other government agencies
- d. Any valid ID or pertinent documentation issued by establishments permitted to operate during the MECQ period.

Section 17. ***Imposition of Barangay Lockdown.*** – A barangay lockdown may also be imposed by the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) at the instance of the Punong Barangay within their respective jurisdiction when circumstances warrant. The Punong Barangay must coordinate and give prior notice to the City Mayor and the Emergency Operations Center before the imposition of any lockdown.

Section 18. ***Imposition of Sitio Lockdown.*** – In the imposition of sitio lockdown within the barangay, the Punong Barangay must make a written assessment, recommendation, and notice to the City Mayor or the Emergency Operations Center prior to the imposition of any sitio lockdown.

Section 19. ***Continuation of Mandatory COVID-19 Testing for Persons Deprived of Liberty (PDL) and Children in Conflict with the Law (CICL).*** – Persons Deprived of Liberty (PDL) and Children in Conflict with the Law (CICL) shall still undergo COVID-19 testing before admission into or release from the Cebu City Jail and the Cebu City Operation Second Chance Center, as provided under Executive Order Nos. 071 and 074, Series of 2020, respectively.

Section 20. ***Implementation of Approved Ordinances to Curtail the COVID-19 Pandemic.*** – This Executive Order shall be implemented side by side with the following City Ordinances, as numbered: 2561 (Anti-Hoarding and Anti-Panic Buying Ordinance); 2563 (Anti-Discrimination Against Medical and Non-Medical Frontliners Ordinance); 2570 (Establishing Food Bank In Times of Public Health Emergencies Ordinance); 2573 (Prohibiting Discrimination Against Persons Inflicted by Any Communicable Disease Ordinance); 2606 (Amending the Anti-Noise Ordinance); 2607 (Ordinance Penalizing Drunkenness in Any Public Place); 2624 (Public Health Emergency Response Ordinance); 2566 (Implementation of General/Enhanced Community Quarantine Ordinance); 2576, 2592, and 2628 (Amending Ordinance No. 2566); and all the approved ordinances of the 15th Sangguniang Panlungsod to curtail the COVID-19 pandemic.



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III
INSTITUTIONAL GUIDELINES

Section 21. ***Permitted Establishments, Persons, or Activities at Full On-Site Capacity or 50% On-Site Capacity.*** – Only those establishments, persons, or activities that are permitted to operate, work, or be undertaken at full on-site capacity or 50% on-site capacity during the MECQ period, consistent with the latest Inter-Agency Task Force Guidelines.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, these establishments, persons, or activities are strongly encouraged to adopt work-from-home and other flexible work arrangements during the MECQ period. Moreover, those sixty (60) years old and above, as well as those with immunodeficiency, comorbidity, or other health risk, and pregnant women may opt to adopt work-from-home and other flexible work arrangements.

Section 22. ***Absolute Prohibition of Operations during the MECQ Period.*** – Unless a new negative list shall be provided by the Inter-Agency Task Force or the Department of Industry, these establishments, persons, or activities shall not be permitted to operate, work, or be undertaken during the MECQ period, to wit:

- a. Entertainment venues with live performers such as karaoke bars, bars, clubs, concert halls, theaters, and cinemas
- b. Recreational venues such as internet cafes, billiard halls, amusement arcades, bowling alleys, and similar venues
- c. Amusement parks or theme parks, *fairs/peryas*, kid amusement industries such as playgrounds, playrooms, and kiddie rides
- d. Outdoor sports courts or venues for contact sports, scrimmages, games, or activities
- e. Indoor sports courts or venues, fitness studios, gyms, spas or other indoor leisure centers or facilities, and swimming pools
- f. Casinos, horse racing, cockfighting and operation of cockpits, lottery and betting shops, and other gaming establishments except for the draws conducted by the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office
- g. Indoor visitor or tourist attractions, libraries, archives, museums, galleries, and cultural shows and exhibits
- h. Outdoor tourist attractions
- i. Venues for meetings, incentives, conferences, and exhibitions
- j. Personal care services which include beauty salons, beauty parlors, medical aesthetic clinics, cosmetic or derma clinics, make-up salons, nail spas, reflexology, aesthetics, wellness and holistic centers, and other similar establishments; acupuncture and electrocautery establishments, and massage therapy including sports therapy establishments.



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It also includes establishments providing tanning services, body piercings, tattooing, and similar services. Home service for these activities is likewise not permitted

- k. Indoor dine-in services of food preparation establishments such as commissaries, restaurants, and eateries.

Section 23. Food Production and Livelihood. – The Cebu City Government shall immediately adopt, create, and execute programs that are aimed towards strengthening food production, food security, income generation, and hunger alleviation. Coordination with various national agencies for funds, programs, and projects for the said purpose is a must. Further, the city government shall coordinate, adopt and complement the programs of other local government units in the island of Cebu to ensure an ample food supply and promote income-generating activities.

Section 24. Operations of Carbon Market, Public Markets, Wet Markets, and Other Bagsakan. – Public market administrators, vendors' associations, barangay officials, and stakeholders of the respective barangays shall come up with their own guidelines in regulating the movements of all people operating, buying, and selling in the markets that shall be consistent with this Executive Order and the Inter-Agency Task Force Guidelines. Provided, that the minimum requirement for movement in markets shall be the presentation of any proof of identity and a Certificate of Employment.

Violations committed in the operations of the Carbon Market, public markets, wet markets, and other bagsakan during the MECQ period shall be met with stricter sanctions, which shall include, but not be limited to closure.

Section 25. Operations of Malls, Markets, and Essential Retail Stores; Business Hours. – Consistent with the Inter-Agency Task Force Guidelines, the Task Force "Puyo" shall monitor the compliance of malls, supermarkets, grocery stores, agri-fishery supply stores, veterinary supply stores, pharmacies, drug stores, and other retail establishments engaged in the business of selling essential goods.

Markets and essential retail stores may be allowed to operate for a maximum of twelve (12) hours per day.

Section 26. Operations of Hotels and Accommodation Establishments. – Consistent with the Inter-Agency Task Force Guidelines, the Task Force "Puyo" shall monitor the compliance of hotels and accommodation establishments operating and accommodating guests for legitimate purposes, provided that they can show a Certificate of Authority to Operate from the Department of Tourism, and in some instances, from the Bureau of Quarantine.



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Ancillary establishments within the premises, such as restaurants, cafes, bars, gyms, spas, and the like, shall not be allowed to operate or to provide room service.

However, there is no stopping these accommodation establishments from preparing packed meals for distribution to guests who opt for the same and accepting food orders for take-out and delivery.

Section 27. **Operations of Public and Private Laboratories.** – Public and privately run laboratories conducting RT-PCR Tests and other testing methods for the detection of SARS-COV-2 and their several variants and iterations are hereby required to exact verifiable details from their patients by requiring the latter to present any proof of identity for verification purposes.

Section 28. **Promotion of Health-Enhancing Behaviors in Businesses and/or Offices.** – In addition to the minimum public health standards, all establishments, persons, and activities that are permitted to operate during the MECQ period shall promote and perform health-enhancing behaviors such as, but not limited to:

- a. Ensuring adequate sleep and rest periods for workers
- b. Installation of air purifiers with high-efficiency particulate air (HEPA) filter and ionizers with a capacity that is proportionate to the floor area of the establishment or office
- c. Regular cleaning, disinfecting, and sterilizing the establishment or office with Ultraviolet Germicidal Light after business hours
- d. Wearing of personal air purifiers.

Section 29. **Essential Gatherings, When Allowed.** – Gatherings that are essential for the provision of health services, government services, or humanitarian activities authorized by the Cebu City Government shall be allowed.

Religious gatherings shall be allowed up to ten percent (10%) of the venue capacity, provided that there is no objection from the Cebu City Government where the religious gathering may take place. The religious denominations should strictly observe protocols and the minimum public health standards.

Gatherings for necrological services, wakes and interment held in sitios, chapels, churches, and the like, and funerals for those who died of causes other than COVID-19 shall be allowed provided that the same shall be limited to immediate family members, upon satisfactory proof of their relationship with the deceased and with full compliance with the prescribed minimum public health standards for the duration of the activity; and must not exceed three days.



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Section 30. **Public and Private Transportation, and Other Alternative Modes.** – All public utility buses (PUBs), vans-for-hire (V-Hires), modernized and traditional public utility jeepneys (MPUJs and TPUJs), public utility vehicles (PUVs), taxis, transport network vehicle service (TNVS), and shuttle services shall be allowed to operate.

Private transportation such as official agency vehicles, company shuttles, and personal vehicles utilized by Authorized Persons Outside Residence (APORs) are allowed to operate subject to the guidelines provided by City Ordinance No. 2628, the Department of Transportation (DOTr), and other laws.

The use of active transportation such as biking and non-motorized transportation is strongly encouraged.

Section 31. **Strict Observation of Minimum Public Health Standards in Public Transportation.** – The strict and mandatory observance of the minimum public health standards in public utility vehicles as provided by City Ordinance No. 2628 is hereby emphasized.

In relation thereto, loading and unloading of passengers must only be made at the designated bus or jeepney stops. The PUVs shall post on their windshields the maximum capacity allowed as provided by City Ordinance No. 2628.

Section 32. **"Open-Windows" Policy.** – All drivers of public utility buses (PUBs), vans-for-hire (V-Hires), modernized and traditional public utility jeepneys (MPUJs and TPUJs), public utility vehicles (PUVs), taxis, transport network vehicle service (TNVS), and shuttle are required to open their windows when carrying passengers. As an alternative, the operators may open the doors without compromising safety of all passengers.

For air-conditioned vehicles and vehicles with windows that cannot be retracted or opened, owners and operators are encouraged to secure and provide air purifiers with high-efficiency particulate air (HEPA) filters and ionizers with a capacity proportionate to the area of the vehicle; or must reduce passenger capacity, as provided by City Ordinance No. 2628.

A period of seven-two (72) hours shall be given for the owners and operators of the public utility vehicles to comply with the immediately preceding paragraph. Failure to comply with this requirement shall bar the owner or operator from plying on streets and taking passengers.

Section 33. **Ports and Other Points of Entry; Exceptions.** – All persons, before entering the City of Cebu through any of the ports and other points of entry, shall be required to present any proof of identity as mentioned in Section 16 hereof, and any



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of the following documents: (a) Negative RT-PCR Test Result taken within the last 72 hours; or (b) Negative Antigen Test Result taken within the last 48 hours. The Tests must be conducted and performed by accredited and licensed testing centers and laboratories by the Department of Health.

Truck drivers and their assistant/s, (one assistant for six-wheeler trucks; two assistants for 10 wheeler trucks and up) delivering essential goods to the City from other ports, for five times a week or more, are exempted from compliance of this Section, but are still subject to the usual symptoms screening in their respective ports of entry.

Falsification of Test Results shall be penalized under the Revised Penal Code and other laws.

Section 34. ***Inter-Island Travel; Restrictions.*** – Travel into or transit through the City of Cebu from other islands shall be prohibited, except for the following:

- a. Authorized government officials and employees
- b. Health and emergency workers
- c. Law enforcement personnel, including the police, military, and force multipliers
- d. Authorized Persons Outside Residence (APORs)
- e. Trucks and vehicles transporting all types of cargoes.

Section 35. ***Selling and Serving of Liquor and Other Alcoholic Beverages, Prohibition.*** – The selling and serving of liquor and other alcoholic beverages are prohibited during the entire MECQ period and until such time that the prohibition is expressly lifted through a subsequent Executive Order.

Section 36. ***Disturbance of Peace.*** – Acts such as using karaoke machines that cause loud noises, wandering at night or while engaging in nocturnal amusements shall disturb public peace, causing any disturbance or scandal in public places while intoxicated or otherwise, discharging any firearm, rocket, firecracker calculated to cause alarm or danger, or taking part in any *charivari* or other disorderly meeting offensive to another or prejudicial to public tranquility are punishable under the Revised Penal Code, City Ordinance No. 2606, City Ordinance No. 2607, and other laws, and shall be prosecuted in the proper courts.

Section 37. ***Temporary Suspension of Demolitions.*** – Consistent with the Mandatory "Stay-At-Home" Order as stated in these rules, the City strongly advises the courts and other administrative bodies to consider the suspension of the implementation of eviction and demolition of informal settlers' houses and dwelling units, for the duration of this Executive Order.



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Section 38. **Penalties.** – Any violation of any provision of this Executive Order and other earlier Executive Orders issued in relation to the COVID-19 pandemic shall be subject to penalties pursuant to existing national laws and local ordinances.

IV.
FINAL MATTERS

Section 39. **Incorporation Clause.** – All laws, legal orders, rules, and regulations that have been issued and/or will be issued by the duly constituted authorities of the Republic of the Philippines, particularly the Inter-Agency Task Force -MEID, pertaining to public health and COVID-19 are incorporated herein and made integral parts hereof. In case of conflict, such laws, legal orders, rules, and regulations shall take precedence over the provisions of this Executive Order. All prior Executive Orders and issuances that are not inconsistent and irreconcilable with this Executive Order are hereby adopted.


Section 40. **Separability Clause.** – Should any provision of the Executive Order be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction as invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining provisions not otherwise adversely affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 41. **Repealing Clause.** – All executive orders, issuance, rules and regulations, memoranda of the City of Cebu or any part thereof which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Executive Order are hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.

Section 42. **Effectivity Clause.** – This Executive Order shall take effect immediately upon signing hereof until August 31, 2021 unless circumstances warrant for its extension..
